California-American Water Company (California American Water) (U210W) hereby submits for filing the following tariffs applicable to its Monterey District:

Purpose:

This advice letter filing seeks review and approval for recovery of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Memorandum Account authorized in D. 09-07-022, effective July 9, 2009 and implemented by Advice Letters 782 and 652-A. California American Water recorded two separate \$1.1 million payments to the NOAA Memorandum Account (June 16, 2010 and June 10, 2011). The memorandum account was established to track required

payments to NOAA for Endangered Species Act (ESA) mitigation activities on the Carmel River per a 2009 agreement between the two parties.

California American Water requests that the \$2.2 million, plus accumulated interest, be transferred to the expense balancing account for recovery effective May 1, 2012.

Background:

Submission of these tariffs is made per the settlement agreement appended to D. 09-07-022, dated July 9, 2009, which states:

4.3 NOAA Memorandum Account

DRA concurs with California American Water's request to continue this memorandum account to record payments California American Water makes to NOAA or its designee as specified under the 2006 settlement agreement between California American Water and NOAA.¹

and Ordering Paragraph 1 of D. 09-07-022:

The Partial Settlement Agreement between the Division of Ratepayer Advocates and the California-American Water Company on Monterey Water and Wastewater issues, filed November 24, 2008, is approved...

and Standard Practice (SP) U-27-W adds that:

Recovery of a memo account requires a Tier 3 advice letter with full justification of all expenses and a recorded earnings test for the calendar year period during which the expense was incurred. The average monthly balance of the account accrues interest at the 90-day commercial paper rate...Recovery of a memo account requires a Tier 3 advice letter and resolution, which transfers the balance in the memo account to a balancing account and will institute either a surcharge or surcredit.²

On March 17, 2010, California American Water filed a request for recovery of the first \$3.5 million payment to NOAA, including interest, in Advice Letter 825-A. The California Public Utilities Commission approved that request in Resolution W-4836 on July 29, 2010.³

Request:

The total requested recovery, including interest, is approximately \$2,206,873, or 5.04% of 2011 authorized revenue. Pursuant to SP U-27-W, memorandum account amortization surcharges are usually spread over two years for under-collections of 5% to 10% of gross revenues.⁴

California American Water proposes collecting the \$2,206,873 through a volumetric-based surcharge. The surcharge would be levied on all customers in the Monterey Main system only. The Bishop, Hidden Hills, Ryan Ranch, Toro, Ambler, Ralph Lane and Chualar systems are currently exempt from this surcharge.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.

Tier Designation:

This advice letter is submitted with a Tier 3 designation.

Effective Date:

California American Water requests that the review and approval of this advice letter be made effective on May 1, 2012 or the effective date of a Resolution.

Service List:

In accordance with Section 4.3 of General Order 96-B, a copy of this advice letter is being furnished to those entities listed in Exhibit A.

Protests and Responses:

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter.

A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:


