

## Further Information

To obtain a copy of the Application or for further information regarding the application you may contact the local field office. The Application and related exhibits may also be inspected. ## Evidentiary Hearings

The CPUC may schedule formal Evidentiary Hearings (EH's) whereby formal parties of record provide testimony and are subject to cross examination before the CPUC's Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). These hearings are open to the public to listen, but only those who are formal parties of record are allowed to participate. The CPUC has their own court reporters who will take the comment of those formal parties of record participating in the EH's. The water companies that submitted the proposed Application will provide testimony at the hearings. The Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA) consists of engineers, accountants, economists and attorneys who independently evaluate the proposals of utilities for and present their analyses and recommendations for the CPUC at EH's. Once hearings are completed, the ALJ will consider all of the evidence presented and release the proposed draft decision. When the CPUC issues a final decision, it may adopt, amend, or modify all or part of the ALJ's draft decision. The final decision may differ from the requests in the proposed applications filed by each water utility listed above.

## Public Comments

If you wish to comment on this proposed application filing or informally protest this filing as a customer of California American Water, you may do so by contacting the CPUC's Public Advisor's Office (PAO). ## NOTICE OF APPLICATION FILING BY CALIFORNIA-AMERICAN WATER COMPANY FOR AN AUTHORIZED COST OF CAPITAL INCREASE FOR UTILITY OPERATIONS FOR 2012-2014 IN ALL DISTRICTS

### RATE INCREASE REQUEST MONTEREY COUNTY DISTRICT

Application No. 11-05-003

On May 2, 2011, California American Water filed proposed Application 11-05-003 (A.11-05-003) with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) seeking authority to increase its Cost of Capital (COC) for the period 2012-2013 for all districts. The districts affected by the COC proposed increase are **Larkfield, Los Angeles, Monterey, Monterey (Toro), Monterey Wastewater, Sacramento, San Diego and Ventura.**

The CPUC sets the schedule for cost of capital applications and requires California American Water to file a cost of capital application every three years. Water utilities such as California American Water have a constitutional right to the opportunity to earn a return on their utility capital investments. While the CPUC must set rates that allow water utilities this opportunity, these rates do not guarantee that the utility will earn this return. The CPUC bases the rate of return on the COC needed to fund the investments. This CPUC proceeding will analyze California American Water's cost of capital and set the proper rate of return.



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The requested increase to California American Water's COC will allow California American Water to continue to ensure the integrity of the water supply system and the provision of safe and clean drinking water. California American Water's request in A.11-05-003 is dependent on the outcome of two special requests in the company's current General Rate Case application filing (A.10-07-007), which address the interest rate on authorized costs that have not yet been recovered through rates.

If the CPUC grants California American Water's special requests, California American Water requests that the CPUC find reasonable and authorize:

- a capital structure of 50.31% debt and 49.69% equity
- a cost of debt of 6.70%
- a return on common equity of 11.50%
- a weighted average return on rate base of 9.08%

If the CPUC does not grant California American Water's special requests, California American Water requests that the CPUC find reasonable and authorize:

- a capital structure of 37.84% debt and 62.16% equity
- a cost of debt of 6.70%
- a return on common equity of 11.50%
- a weighted average return on rate base of 9.68%

**Summary**

The first table below shows the current and proposed rate impacts on the average **Monterey District** residential customer with a standard (5/8 inch x 3/4 inch) meter. The second table shows the proposed increase in revenues per customer classification. The figures in the tables do not include applicable taxes and surcharges. The figures in the tables are assuming the CPUC approves the COC proposed by California American Water. The final CPUC decision may differ from California American Water's request.
