Purpose:

This advice letter filing seeks review and approval of the compliance payments made by California American Water to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration ("NOAA") or its designated payee for Federal Endangered Species Act ("ESA") mitigation in the Monterey County District. These payments have been tracked in the NOAA ESA Memorandum Account which was approved by the California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") in AL 652-A and AL 653 and recently affirmed in Decision ("D.") 18-12-021.

Background:

Per the settlement agreements adopted in D.12-06-016 and D.15-04-007, the Division of Ratepayer Advocates ("DRA") and the Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA"), respectively, now the California Public Advocates, and California American Water agreed to retain the NOAA/ESA memorandum account to track the compliance payments made by California American Water to NOAA or its designated payee for ESA mitigation. The parties agreed recovery of annual payments shall be through a Tier 2 advice letter. The parties also agreed that should California American Water incur costs to address to-be determined obligations in connection with an extension of the NOAA Agreement beyond 2016, California American Water it may file a Tier 3 advice letter to request such costs be included in the NOAA/ESA memorandum account.

In D.18-12-021 the Commission authorized continuation of the NOAA ESA Memorandum Account. Specifically, Conclusion of Law Paragraph 142 states the following:

142. The continuation of the National Oceanic and Atmosphere Administration Endangered Species Act Memorandum Account, including Cal-Am's ability to seek recovery of any future required annual payments through this account, should be authorized.

California American Water recorded four separate \$1.1 million annual payments to the NOAA ESA Memorandum Account (January 2018, June 2018, June 2019, and June 2020). In addition, California American Water will be refunding \$653,824 to Monterey County District customers due to an over-collection between 2013 and 2014.

Request:

California American Water requests that the \$3.8 million (including customer credit) and accumulated interest, be transferred to the consolidated expense balancing account (CEBA) for recovery over four years effective October 19, 2020.

The total requested recovery to be transferred, including interest, to the CEBA is \$3,820,757, and total CEBA recovery is \$4,939,095. Once transferred, the CEBA balance will be 7.24% of 2020 authorized revenue. The Monterey CEBA surcharge of \$.0831 per 100 gallons will be collected for 24 months. Pursuant to SP U-27-W¹, memorandum account amortization surcharges are usually spread over two years for under-collections under 10% of gross revenues, which is the request here.

The surcharge would be levied on all customers in the Monterey Service Area only. The Toro, Ambler, Ralph Lane and Chualar (Central Satellite) systems are currently exempt from this surcharge.

California American Water additionally requests approval of the updated NOAA ESA Memorandum Account description to account for the extension of the NOAA Agreement beyond

2016 and the approvals granted in D.18-12-021. On December 28, 2018, D. 18-12-021, extended the agreement.

- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies:
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material errors or omissions:
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission).

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.
